CAR SEATS/CHILD RESTRAINTS

We are very concerned by reports that some of our children are not being appropriately restrained when travelling in cars to and from the centre. It is the law that all children under 5 are to use appropriate child restraints/car seats at ALL TIMES when travelling in a vehicle. This also applies if you have someone else dropping off/collecting your child - they MUST have a carseat in their vehicle and ensure that the child is safely restrained!! We care very much about the safety of all our Playhouse children and would be devastated if they were to become injured in a car accident due to not being properly restrained.



SCHOOL HOURS

If your child is enrolled for our "school hours' please make sure that you stick to their booked times (8.30-3.30/8.45-3.45/9.00-4.00). We have noticed quite a few children arriving before or leaving after their booked times which affects the smooth running of the centre - please be aware that our "out of hours" fee of \$10 per 10 minutes will now be applied to your account in these instances as school hour days are for the set times only

Please make sure you are familiar with our Accidents, Illness and Medication policy so that there are no surprises about our 24 hour stand-down period. This stand-down period is in force for the greater good of everyone at the centre
